

2024-2025 spirit of nebraska Honor Troop Requirements

The Honor Troop program recognizes troops that provide strong, balanced programs for Girl Scouts at all age levels. This program promotes girl/adult partnerships, girl planning, community service, and involvement. Honor Troops are recognized in Spirit of Nebraska online and print publications. Each troop will receive a signed Honor Troop Certificate and each girl in the troop will receive an Honor Troop Patch.

Please use this document to track your accomplishments throughout the year. To apply for 2024-2025 Honor Troop status, your application must be completed online at by June 30, 2025. Please save this PDF to your computer BEFORE typing your information into the fields below. Adobe Acrobat's "Fill & Sign" tool is recommended—it's free!

HONOR TROOP REOUIREMENTS

- Troops must complete all "Required Items" (1-17).
- Troops must also complete "Additional Items" (18-39) as follows:
 - Daisy troops must complete 5 additional items.
 - Brownie and Junior troops must complete 7 additional items.
 - Cadette, Senior, Ambassador, and Multi-Level troops must complete 9 additional items.
- An event or activity may only be used once.
- Complete chosen events and activities from items below by June 30, 2025.
- Enter dates into the online application (at www.GirlScoutsNebraska.org/honortroop) by June 30, 2025. Late applications will not be accepted.

REOUIRED ITEMS

Specify the date accomplished in the space provided (MM/DD/YYYY) for each item.

- 1. Membership registrations were completed online by 9/30/24 for returning members of existing troops or by the first meeting for new troops.
- 2. The troop has enough registered and background-screened adults on their roster to comply with Volunteerto-Girl Ratios.
- 3. All adults registered as "troop co-leader" have completed the required training within one month of the troop starting for the school year.
 - 4. The troop has established and maintained a bank account with at least two authorized signers, as well as a Troop Support Specialist as an authorized signer, as required by GSSN guidelines.
 - 5. The troop has held at least two parent meetings throughout the year, encouraging parents to participate in the troop and fostering good communication and teamwork. Best times to hold a parent meeting: backto-school, cookie season, end-of-year (wrap up), etc. (guides to help you run these meetings can be found on our website).
- 6. The troop has a plan for regularly communicating with parents/caregivers.
 - 7. Troop co-leaders offer opportunities for parents/caregivers to be involved in troop activities and/or outings.
 - 8. A troop planning session has been conducted during the year. Girl interests and ideas are incorporated into the yearly calendar.
 - 9. Utilize the Volunteer Toolkit (VTK) in learning to plan your Girl Scout Troop year. Plan at least one meeting using the VTK.
 - 10. The troop is represented at one or more of the following volunteer-focused events:
 - Volunteer/Service Unit Meeting
 - Leader Networking Events
 - Volunteer Weekend Retreat Weekend and/or Volunteer Award Ceremony
