Bake cupcakes or cookies and give them to your friends, family, or local first responders to celebrate JGL's birthday.	Wear your favorite Girl Scout T-shirt or uniform to school, practice, or around the neighborhood.  Shop online to find a T-shirt today!	Support kids in need in your community by collecting clothing, food, school supplies, etc. Connect with local nonprofits to see where there is a need.	Brainstorm a way to be a friend to every Girl Scout. Have your troop join a circle and everyone share their ideas. Start with saying, "I Promise to" thereby making a pact like the age-old Buddy System.
Form a partnership with another troop within the Council or in another state and <b>become pen pals.</b>	Gather birthday party supplies, like boxed cake mix and decorations, and donate them to your local food pantry.
